<p>ABSENTEE VOTING (IN-PERSON)</p>	<p>From Sept. 22 to Nov. 2 at 5 p.m., visit your local election authority and complete an absentee application.</p>	<p>Receive your ballot and cast it at that time.</p>		
<p>ABSENTEE VOTING</p>	<p>Request in person, by mail, email or fax. Application must be received by local election authority no later than Oct. 21.</p>	<p>Receive ballot by mail and complete it promptly.</p>	<p>Have your ballot envelope notarized if necessary. (See below.)</p>	<p>Return ballot in person or by mail. Must be received by local election authority no later than 7 p.m. on Nov. 3.</p>
<p>MAIL-IN VOTING</p>	<p>Request in person or by mail. Application must be received by local election authority no later than Oct. 21.</p>	<p>Receive ballot by mail and complete it promptly.</p>	<p>Have your ballot envelope notarized.</p>	<p>Return ballot by U.S. Mail only. Must be received by local election authority no later than 7 p.m. on Nov. 3.</p>
